Dear Friends in Christ,

And so, the long, lazy days of summer are fast coming to an end; the noisome, crowded beaches will soon grow quiet and serene; the phlegmatic traffic on Kings Highway and Ocean Boulevard and Broadway will loosen, and the drivers shall breathe more freely; the oppressive heat of the sun will lose its vigor, and then the quick, cool days of fall and winter will be upon us. And, just as surely as the changing season will be marked by falling leaves and the smell of pumpkin spice at Starbucks, so will we observe that most time-honored fall tradition: back to school!

The end of summer vacation is here, and that means for us here at St. Andrew's a new year for our school, as well as the return of Religious Education classes. The students at St. Andrew's School will return on Tuesday, August 21st and will the next week begin their attendance at Wednesday daily Mass. Our parishioners who regularly attend the daily Mass always speak highly of our students, especially of their reverence and the beauty and talent of the school choir. I encourage everyone who can to join us for the Wednesday morning Mass, to offer praise and thanksgiving to God along with our faculty and students.

Also, our Religious Education Classes will resume on Wednesday, September 5th. All school age children of St. Andrew's families up to the 8th grade who are not students at St. Andrew's school or another Catholic school should be registered for Religious Education classes, as well as any high school age students who have yet to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. If you need to register your child for Religious Education, please stop by the Religious Education Center (small house directly behind the church) after Mass this Saturday and Sunday. All children must be registered before classes begin on September 5th.

It is a serious duty of parents to educate their children in the Catholic faith. This education begins in the home, where the parents should provide a strong example of Christian faith, life, and prayer for their children. But this duty also extends to formal education. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* section 2229 says, "As those first responsible for the education of their children, parents have a right to *choose a school for them* which corresponds to their own convictions.... As far as possible parents have the duty of choosing schools that will best help them in their task as Christian educators." To educate their children in the Catholic faith is both a right and a duty of Catholic parents. So, to all our parents with children of appropriate age to attend St. Andrew's School, I encourage you to consider our school, where the faith of our students is nurtured in an environment of prayer and Christian family. And for those who choose public education, I encourage you to register your children for our Religious Education classes, where they will learn the faith from excellent catechists, find friendship and communion with other Catholic children, and begin to see the parish family as part of their extended family. To the entire parish, I ask you to pray for all our students, and for all the faculty and staff at St. Andrew's school and all our local public schools, as well as for our Religious Education catechists, that this year may be filled with fun, learning, and growth for us all in holiness.

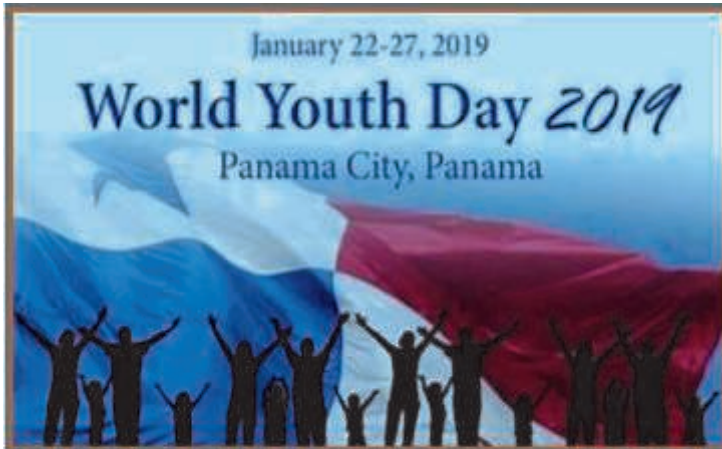
PARISH NEWS**Respect Life Ministry**

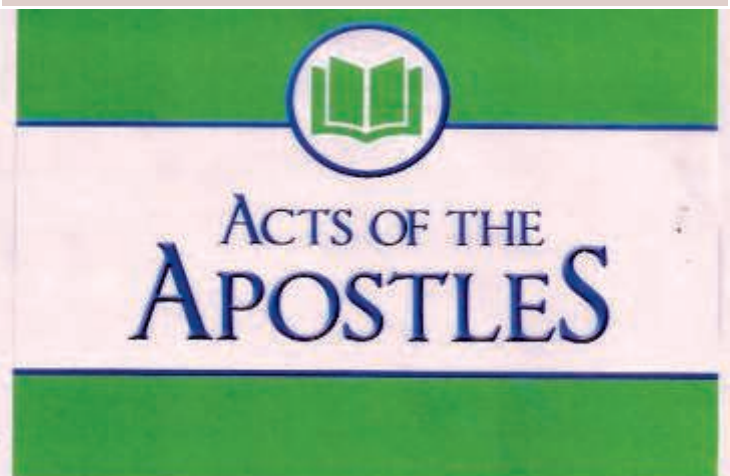

Constitution Week: September 17-23

On September 17, 1787, the United States Constitution was adopted and is our most important document.

Our country is unique in that our Constitution acknowledges that a government's power comes from the people and not from a king, ruler, or dictator.

The Founding Fathers, and many Americans in the early years of the Republic, regarded the Constitution as a miracle. Americans praised the competence, wisdom, and motivations of those who served in the federal convention of 1787. They declared that the formation and adoption of our new system of government represented a political achievement unprecedented in human history.

U.S. Public Law 108-447 requires that all Public Schools receiving federal funds must teach about the Constitution on September 17 every year. Constitution Week is to be celebrated from Sept. 17-23. The Dept. of Education and most State Education Departments provide many suggestions for lesson plans.

There is much to teach and to learn about this document that the Founders believed was "influenced, guided and governed" by the hand of God. They believed the Constitution was destined to bless all mankind - and that it was "incumbent on their successors" to preserve and defend our national charter of liberty.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

In this Sunday's Gospel, the conflict escalates in the Bread of Life Discourse. Confusion is mounting in the crowd. "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" Their minds were thinking literally, not mystically. Jesus doesn't seem to help, however, and only drives his point home with more emphasis. "Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you." Jesus would later institute the Eucharist at the Last Supper. There he would definitively establish the sacramental reality in which bread and wine become substantially his own Body and Blood. We celebrate this sacrament in the Mass.

Perhaps we do not always understand what we receive. "My flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink." What is the essence of food and drink? Food nourishes our bodies, providing essential calories for our survival. Water is used throughout the body to cushion joints, regulate body temperature, and protect sensitive tissues like the brain. When we receive the Eucharist, we receive the spiritual equivalent of these essential elements. Like water, the Eucharist strengthens the sanctifying grace moving through us. "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him." The Eucharist connects us intimately to Jesus and confirms our union with him. That is why we abstain from the Eucharist while in a state of mortal sin. It would be a contradiction and deep disrespect to these words of Jesus. To receive the Body and Blood of Jesus is not a right but a gift we receive with deep humility.

As we receive the Bread of Life, grace strengthens our love, separates us from sin -- even wiping away venial sins -- unifies us with the universal Church, and helps commit us to humble service. Together we are nourished for our mission in the world!

ESTA FIESTA EUCARÍSTICA

Ciertos aspectos de la naturaleza humana nunca cambian, ni siquiera en el transcurso de varios siglos. En la primera lectura de hoy, la Sabiduría está preparando un banquete, un símbolo de la celebración de la alianza que Israel tiene con Dios. La conmemoración central de su alianza salvadora del Éxodo es la comida de la pascua judía. Por lo tanto, es natural y no casual que la celebración cristiana de la nueva alianza sellada por la sangre de Cristo en la cruz sea una comida, nuestra Eucaristía, la cual primero fue ofrecida por Jesús durante la conmemoración de la pascua judía. Algunas veces nos resulta fácil olvidar el rico origen religioso y humano de nuestro banquete eucarístico de pan y vino que son el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Jesús. Hoy y en los próximos domingos que escuchemos el discurso sobre el "Pan de Vida" por boca de Juan, recordemos la generosa alianza que Dios forja con nosotros y llenémonos de alegría con este maravilloso banquete al que somos invitados.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Entre los varios santitos que de niño recuerdo haber visto en el templo, santa Rosa de Lima (1586-1617) se me ha quedado grabada por su belleza y humildad. No sé quién fue el que me la presentó por primera vez, sólo sé que la recuerdo porque era latina como yo. En su cabeza llevaba una corona de espinas de la cual brotaban rositas rojas. Según mis catequistas, ella había usado una corona de espinas a escondidas debajo de su velo de monja para recordarle que si era bella lo debía a Dios y no a sus propios méritos.

Santa Rosa (Isabel Flores de Oliva) fue canonizada en 1667 como la primera santa americana. Ella encarnaba la expresión "Gracias a Dios". Esta frase la utilizan muchos latinos cuando reciben un cumplido o halago, para reconocer que sus talentos y virtudes se deben a Dios que bendice sus esfuerzos. Ellos, como Santa Rosa, aceptan las limitaciones de su condición humana pero también aceptan la gracia de ser hijas e hijos del Dios que siempre nos ayuda.
