Dear Friends in Christ,

This week we continue our look at Catholic Lists-of-Seven with the Seven Works of Corporal Mercy, which are:

- 1) To feed the hungry.
- 2) To give drink to the thirsty.
- 3) To clothe the naked.
- 4) To shelter the homeless.
- 5) To visit the sick.
- 6) To visit the imprisoned.
- 7) To bury the dead.

This list is firmly grounded in Sacred Scripture. After his triumphant entry into Jerusalem, two days before the Passover, gathered together on the Mount of Olives, Jesus gives his disciples a long and wide-ranging discourse, which concludes with what is often called the parable of the Sheep and the Goats. Jesus tells the disciples that when the Son of Man returns he will gather all the nations before him, and separate the people one from another as a shepherd separates sheep from goats, placing the sheep on his right and the goats on his left. The sheep shall inherit the kingdom promised to them by the Father, we are told, because they gave food to the hungry, drink to the thirsty, clothing to the naked, visited the imprisoned, and cared for the sick. But the goats shall be sent into eternal fire, precisely because they failed in these corporal works of mercy.

So— these words of Jesus make clear that our final judgment will depend not solely on our profession of faith, but also upon our works of mercy, or lack thereof. And so, we should all know the corporal works of mercy, and seek to fulfill them. Here at St. Andrew's, we have a special need for Extraordinary Ministers of Communion to visit the sick, homebound, and those in assisted living. Our Extraordinary Ministers of Communion visit Grand Strand hospital four days a week. If you feel called to join in this ministry, please contact Susan Underwood at our parish office. There are also many opportunities to work with the homeless and hungry. The Knights of Columbus take up a monthly collection that goes to support the work of Helping Hand, a short-term crisis referral agency here in Myrtle Beach, which helps those in need of such necessities as food, rent, and utilities. St. Andrew's also supports the work of Community Kitchen, which provides over four-hundred hot meals to the needy each weekday. And while each of these organizations deeply appreciates your financial support, they also need us to share our time as volunteers. If you feel called to fulfill the works of mercy by sharing your time with those in need, please contact Helping Hand or Community Kitchen. By seeking to fulfill the Corporal Works of Mercy, we are made ready to run out to meet the Lord Jesus when he comes, eager to greet him with our good works.

CATHOLICS FOR FREEDOM OF RELIGION

The Twelve Rules of Christmas – Part 1
Compiled by the Rutherford Institute Attorneys

1. Public school students' written or spoken personal expressions about Christmas (e.g. "Jesus is the Reason for the Season" t-shirts) may not be censored by school officials.
2. Teachers are permitted to wear Christmas-related clothing or jewelry so long as they are generally permitted to wear clothing or jewelry about other holidays.
3. Public schools may teach students about the Christmas holiday, including its religious significance, so long as it is taught objectively for secular purposes such as its historical or cultural importance.
4. Teachers may send Christmas cards to the families of their students so long as they do so on their own time, outside of school hours.
5. Public schools may include Christmas music, including those with religious themes, in their choral programs if the songs are included for a secular purpose such as their musical quality or cultural value or if the songs are part of an overall performance including other holiday songs.
6. Public schools may not require students to sing Christmas songs whose messages conflict with the students' own religious or nonreligious views.

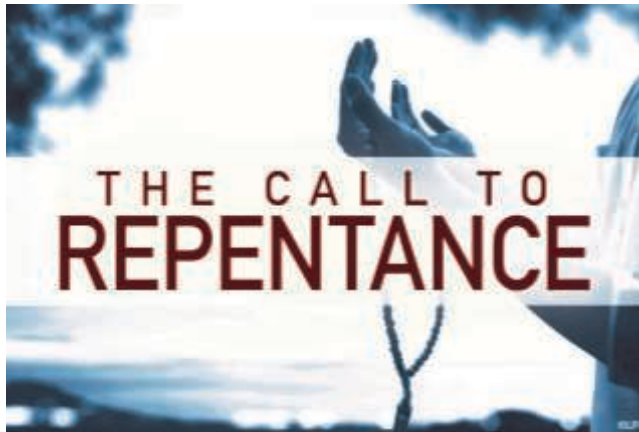

Throughout the world, there are many different traditions associated with Christmas. Las Posadas is celebrated throughout Latin America. "Posada" is Spanish for "inn." Over the course of nine nights, local groups reenact the Holy Family's search for lodging in Bethlehem. Children dress as Mary and Joseph, angels, shepherds, and Wise Men. They go from home to home singing Christmas carols throughout the neighborhood. After several "rejections," the final home welcomes the group for a party. Las Posadas is a social event, a family gathering, and a moral lesson. Las Posadas reminds participants of the importance of hospitality and welcome to those in need.



GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

In Christianity, we hear often about the "Good News." We might often associate it with Jesus' compassion to the poor, his healings and miracles, and the salvation he won for us. In today's Gospel, we read of John the Baptist. "Exhorting them in many other ways, he preached good news to the people." Yet as we examine the rest of the reading, we see examples of John's preaching. If you have two cloaks, give one away. Don't cheat others out of their money, extort, or lie. And, of course, the warning that the Messiah is on the move and "his winnowing fan is in his hand to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire." Merry Christmas? Not only do John's listeners enjoy his message, but they seem to think he might be the awaited Messiah! To understand today's Gospel, it's important to understand the Jewish people. For most of their history, God's chosen people had been under someone else's heel. They were slaves in Egypt. Their kingdoms were ravaged first by the Assyrians, then the Babylonians. Now they were under the yoke of the Roman Empire. Familiar with being strangers in a strange land, welcoming the stranger, caring for the vulnerable, and enacting justice was incredibly important to them as a people. While John's words may seem odd or strong to our modern ears, this call to justice was welcome, even if it was directed at the hearer.

The truth is, no one is exempt from John's call to repentance. We all have further to go in the Christian life. We can all grow in virtue and love our neighbors more generously. The Church gives us the Advent season to examine our own hearts. Did any of John's warnings resonate with you? That could be a great thing to bring to Jesus this week!

ENTENDIMIENTO MÁS PROFUNDO DE LA ESCRITURA (Gospel Meditation)

La salvación que Dios anuncia en este tercer domingo de Adviento trae consigo una profunda alegría. Las lecturas de hoy son clave para profundizar en lo que es la alegría de Dios. Es el domingo de alegría. En latín, "Gaudete," cuyo significado es "alégrense". El profeta Sofonías lo dice así: ¡Grita de gozo, oh hija de Sión,... Regocíjate y que tu corazón esté de fiesta! (Sofonías 3:14). San Pablo lo describe con inmenso gozo de la siguiente manera: "Estén siempre alegres en el Señor; se los repito, estén alegres y tengan buen trato con todos" (Filipenses 4:4). La repetición que hace Pablo hace énfasis en esa alegría que da la paz de Dios, a pesar de los acontecimientos contrarios a lo que vivimos.

¿A dónde debo llevar la alegría que Dios me da? ¿Cómo podemos recuperar la alegría en este Adviento tan comercializado? El Evangelio nos da la respuesta; el Bautista exhorta a la conversión, y sin esa conversión, no puede existir la alegría que es el fruto de las buenas obras. Todos debemos de compartir con los más necesitados: ropa, comida y nuestros bienes, pero, sobre todo, dar la bienvenida al extranjero y al refugiado. ¡Ahora es el tiempo! Ayúdanos Señor a abrir nuestros corazones a las necesidades de otros. Cambia nuestros corazones de piedra por unos más humanos. Que con tu gracia sepamos hacer lo que está bien. Martin Luther King decía: "Siempre es el momento apropiado para hacer lo que es correcto". ¡Ven Señor, ayúdanos a dar alegría y esperanza en todo momento!



IGLESIA CATÓLICA DE SAN ANDRÉS

16 de diciembre de 2018

Queridos amigos en Cristo,

Esta semana continuamos nuestra Siete Listas Católicas con las Siete Obras de Misericordia Corporales, que son:

- 1) Dar de comer al hambriento.
- 2) Dar de beber al sediento.
- 3) Vestir al desnudo.
- 4) Dar posada al peregrino.
- 5) Visitar y cuidar a los enfermos.
- 6) Visitar a los presos.
- 7) Enterrar a los muertos.

Esta lista está firmemente basada en la Sagrada Escritura. Después de su entrada triunfal en Jerusalén, dos días antes de la Pascua, reunidos en el Monte de los Olivos, Jesús les da a sus discípulos un largo y amplio discurso, que concluye con lo que a menudo se llama la parábola de las Ovejas y las Cabras. Jesús les dice a los discípulos que cuando regrese el Hijo del Hombre, reunirá a todas las naciones delante de él, y separará a las personas unas de otras como un pastor separa a las ovejas de las cabras, colocando las ovejas a su derecha y las cabras a su izquierda. Las ovejas heredarán el reino que les prometió el Padre, según se nos dice, porque dieron comida a los hambrientos, bebieron a los sedientos, vestían a los desnudos, visitaron a los encarcelados y cuidaron a los enfermos. Pero las cabras serán enviadas al fuego eterno, precisamente porque fracasaron en estas obras corporales de misericordia.

Entonces, estas palabras de Jesús dejan claro que nuestro juicio final dependerá no solo de nuestra profesión de fe, sino también de nuestras obras de misericordia o falta de ellas. Y así, todos debemos conocer las obras corporales de la misericordia, y tratar de cumplirlas. Aquí, en St. Andrew's, tenemos una necesidad especial de que los Ministros Extraordinarios de Comunión visiten a los enfermos, a los que no pueden salir de sus hogares y a los que viven con asistencia. Nuestros Ministros Extraordinarios de Comunión visitan el hospital de Grand Strand cuatro días a la semana. Si se siente llamado a unirse a este ministerio, comuníquese con Susan Underwood en la oficina de nuestra parroquia. También hay muchas oportunidades para trabajar con personas sin hogar y con hambre. Los Caballeros de Colón toman una colecta mensual que apoya el trabajo de Helping Hand, una agencia de referencia de crisis a corto plazo aquí en Myrtle Beach, que ayuda a los necesitados de alimentos, alquileres y servicios públicos. St. Andrew's también apoya el trabajo de Community Kitchen, que ofrece más de cuatrocientas comidas calientes para los necesitados cada día de la semana. Y mientras cada una de estas organizaciones aprecia profundamente su apoyo financiero, también nos necesitan para compartir nuestro tiempo como voluntarios. Si se siente llamado a cumplir las obras de la misericordia compartiendo su tiempo con los necesitados, comuníquese con Helping Hand o Community Kitchen. Al tratar de cumplir con las Obras de Misericordia Corporales, estamos preparados para salir corriendo para encontrarnos con el Señor Jesús cuando venga, ansiosos por saludarlo con nuestras buenas obras. Tercer Domingo de Adviento

16 de diciembre de 2018

El Señor sera el rey de Israel en medio de ti y ya no temerás ningún mal.
— Sofonías 3:15b

¡REGOCÍJATE!

El día de hoy se le ha llamado tradicionalmente "Domingo *Gaudete*" o de la "Alegría". El nombre latino se deriva de la petición de Pedro en la segunda lectura de "alégrense siempre en el Señor", y del texto de la Misa en latín en el que está basada esta lectura. La ironía y paradoja de esta alegría cristiana se manifiesta en el hecho que Pablo escribió esas palabras en la prisión. Pero desde allí podía ver el progreso de la obra de Dios.

¿Nos parece obvio a nosotros? Sentimos que este no es un tiempo para la alegría cuando hay tanto sufrimiento e inmoralidad. Es interesante, entonces, que la primera lectura sea del profeta Sofonías, que está casi exclusivamente preocupado con sombrías visiones del Día del Juicio. Hoy la Iglesia selecciona la única parte optimista de Sofonías, donde el profeta es tocado por el espíritu del gozo.

Esta es, se nos asegura en todas partes, "la temporada de la alegría". Recuperemos ese espíritu de alegría en nuestra vida y que se refleje en los que no tienen ese gozo.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Los cristianos latinos tenemos unos cinco siglos en nuestra trayectoria de fe y como todo cristiano aguardamos la segunda venida del Mesías, Jesús. Nuestra espera forma parte de dos milenios de cristianos que buscan verlo llegar en las nubes.

Desde el siglo VII la oración oficial de la Iglesia clama el retorno de Cristo con las exclamaciones llamadas las "Antífonas Oh". Estas llaman a Jesús pidiéndole que venga bajo los títulos de Emmanuel, Sabiduría celestial, Señor de gran poder, Vara de Isaí, Llave de David, Alba de la luz, y Deseo y Rey de gentes, y algunos más. Estos refranes se usan aún todavía hoy durante los días 17 al 23 de diciembre, y unidas en un acróstico latino forman las palabras *ero cras* (estaré mañana), como respuesta a la petición cristiana. Eventualmente en el siglo X o XI estas antífonas fueron unidas en el canto gregoriano *Veni, veni Emmanuel* (Oh ven, oh ven Emmanuel).

Este adviento mientras cantamos las antiguas antífonas hay que preguntarnos si de veras estamos listos para el regreso del Hijo del Hombre que viene para juzgar a vivos y muertos.
