Dear Friends in Christ,

We come this week to the final Sunday of Advent and the final list in our series of Catholic Lists-of-Seven. This week, we will be looking at the Seven Deadly Sins, and the corresponding virtues by which we fight them. The Seven Deadly Sins are Pride, Greed, Envy, Anger, Lust, Gluttony, and Sloth.

These seven sins are called “deadly” because they beget further sins. How? These particular sins easily become vices, that is, sinful habits. When such sins become vices, they dull our conscience and cloud our judgment, so that we are less and less capable of recognizing good and evil, less and less capable of living according to sanctifying grace, more and more trapped in the rut of sin. Such a path of habitual sin kills the life of grace in us, and so we call these sins deadly. In order to fight these sins so that they do not become vices, we need to combat them with their opposing virtues.

Pride is the unchecked love and esteem of the self, especially a sense that my good fortune or talent or success is due to me alone, and does not depend upon God. Pride exalts the self as an object of worship and displaces God. To combat the sin of pride, we need the virtue of humility. Where pride produces boasting and selfishness, humility engenders gratitude to God and the ability to share our talents and gifts with other. Greed is the disordered love of earthly possessions, which sees money and treasure as ends in themselves, not as simply the necessary means to us living a rational and secure life. Greed draws our gaze away from heavenly things and fixes it firmly to the things of the world. To combat the sin of greed, we need the virtue of generosity. A greedy person is a hoarder, always taking and storing away; a generous person is capable of freely giving to others whatever he has received, especially to the poor and needy. Envy is the resentment of another’s good fortune or blessings. Envy is not simply to desire another’s gifts and blessings; envy desires that the other lose those gifts and blessings. Envy rejoices when it sees our fellow man brought low. To combat envy, we need the virtue of gratitude. Gratitude turns our gaze away from what God has given others to what God has given me. And when we learn to rejoice in what we have received, we can learn to be glad for the gifts of others as well. Anger or wrath is the disproportionate expression of hostility and the desire for vengeance. Not all anger is sinful. Anger can be righteous when it is in proportion to the demands of justice and reason, but if it exceeds these bounds, it becomes a destructive sin. To combat anger, we need patience. With patience, we can endure injustice without being consumed by the desire for vengeance and destruction. Lust is the disordered desire for or enjoyment of sexual pleasure, especially when this pleasure is sought for itself alone, detached from its unitive and procreative purpose. To combat lust, we need the virtue of chastity. Chastity is the proper integration of our sexuality within the whole of our person, body and spirit. A chaste person has not repressed sexual desire, but by God’s grace has mastered it, so that he is not overwhelmed and dominated by sexual desire. Gluttony is the sin of over consuming food and alcohol. While it is not a sin to enjoy a wonderful meal, even on occasion a sumptuous one, to habitually overindulge in food and drink to the point that we become sick is self-destructive and wastes that which could be shared with the poor. To combat gluttony, we need the virtue of temperance. Temperance helps us to control our bodily desires so that we eat to live, not live to eat. And sloth (sometime called acedia) is the aversion to work, either physical or spiritual. Sloth wants nothing but rest for the self, but expects to benefit from the work of others. To combat sloth, we need diligence. Diligence, born of fortitude, is the ability to remain focused, day after day, on the physical, mental, and spiritual work that is necessary for us to live in security, peace, and holiness.

CATHOLICS FOR FREEDOM OF RELIGION

The Twelve Rules of Christmas – Part 2

Compiled by the Rutherford Institute Attorneys

7. Public school students may not be prohibited from distributing literature to fellow students concerning the Christmas holiday or invitations to church Christmas events on the same terms that they would be allowed to distribute other literature that is not related to schoolwork.
8. Private citizens or groups may display a crèche or other Christmas symbols in public parks subject to the same reasonable time, place, and manner restrictions that would apply to other similar displays.
9. Government entities may erect and maintain celebrations of the Christmas holiday, such as Christmas trees, lights and a creche, at least so long as the purpose is placed in context with other symbols of the Holiday season through their traditional symbols.
10. Employees may decorate their offices for Christmas, play Christmas music, and wear clothing related to Christmas, so long as these activities are not used to intimidate others.
11. Employees whose sincerely held religious beliefs require that they not work on Christmas must be reasonably accommodated by their employers.
12. Government recognition of Christmas as a public holiday and granting government employees a paid holiday for Christmas does not violate the Establishment Clause of the First Amendment.



GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

Here we are, mere days from Christmas, and we hear a Gospel anticipating the birth of another child. Mary has received word that her cousin Elizabeth is with child. Pregnant as she is, Mary "set out and traveled to the hill country in haste." She has recently received the greatest news of her life - that she is to be mother to the Messiah by the power of the Holy Spirit - but her concern is for her cousin in need. Through God's grace, Elizabeth turns it into an opportunity to honor the coming Christ. "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb." Yet Mary's example of selflessness should inspire us.

As Christmas draws near, there is plenty of goodness to anticipate for many of us. We'll reunite with family and friends, uphold time-honored traditions, swap stories old and new, exchange gifts, and welcome Jesus at the Christmas liturgy. These are wonderful things! Of course, they probably all come with their own to-do list. Shop for last-minute gifts, pick up recipe ingredients, ready the guest room, or pack your own bags. Mary probably had things to do as well. She had a lot to consider, for one thing. How do you plan to tell your parents you're pregnant, but no man was involved? When Joseph finds out, who will care for the practical needs of you and your child? Into what may have been a chaos of questions, Mary receives news that someone is in need. She goes immediately.

In these final days before Christmas, stay watchful and awake! You never know when God might invite you to welcome, hospitality, and compassion. It might be tempting to reject the opportunity for your own needs. Follow the example of Mary! If God is providing you an opportunity to love, He will provide the means to accomplish all your other tasks. This Christmas season, may you too hear, "Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled."

Los cálculos lentos no corresponden a la gracia del Espíritu Santo" (San Ambrosio). Este breve resumen que San Ambrosio nos da en su reflexión sobre la Visitación nos prepara para saber acoger las sorpresas de Dios, referente al servicio generoso que se debe tener hacia el que lo necesita.

Salga al encuentro del otro, como nos lo dice el Papa Francisco, "Salida de la Iglesia-que habla de los pobres hacia una Iglesia-que va a los pobres, conversa con ellos, los abraza y los defiende". Dios sale hacia las montañas de Judá y con alegría las dos mujeres se abrazan. El saludo de Isabel lleno del Espíritu Santo resuena en sus entrañas y al momento el niño saltó de alegría. "¡Dichosa tú por haber creído que se cumplirían las promesas del Señor!" (Lucas 1:45). María e Isabel son testigos del amor de Dios en el mundo. "Bendito el fruto de tu vientre" (Lucas 1:42). El Himno Litúrgico del Tiempo de Adviento es una oración hermosa que nos ayuda durante la semana a esperar al Mesías. IGLESIA CATÓLICA DE SAN ANDRÉS

23 de diciembre 2018

Queridos amigos en Cristo,

Venimos esta semana al último domingo de Adviento y la lista final en nuestra Listas Católicas. Esta semana, veremos los Siete Pecados Capitales y las virtudes correspondientes con las que luchamos contra ellos. Los siete pecados capitales son la soberbia, la avaricia, la envidia, la ira, la lujuria, la gula y la pereza.

Estos siete pecados son llamados "capitales" porque engendran más pecados. ¿Cómo? Estos pecados fácilmente se convierten en vicios, es decir, en hábitos pecaminosos. Cuando tales pecados se convierten en vicios, embotan nuestra conciencia y nublan nuestro juicio, de modo que somos cada vez menos capaces de reconocer el bien y el mal, cada vez menos capaces de vivir de acuerdo con la gracia santificadora, cada vez más atrapados en la rutina del pecado. Tal camino de pecado habitual mata la vida de la gracia en nosotros, y por eso llamamos capitales a estos pecados. Para combatir estos pecados para que no se conviertan en vicios, debemos combatirlos con sus virtudes opuestas.

La soberbia es el amor y la estima sin control del yo, especialmente la sensación de que mi buena fortuna, mi talento o mi éxito se deben solo a mí y no dependen de Dios. La soberbia exalta al yo como objeto de adoración y desplaza a Dios. Para combatir el pecado de la soberbia, necesitamos **la virtud de la humildad**. Donde la soberbia produce jactancia y egoísmo, la humildad genera gratitud a Dios y la capacidad de compartir nuestros talentos y dones con los demás. La avaricia es el amor desordenado de las posesiones terrenales, que ve el dinero y el tesoro como fines en sí mismos, no como simplemente los medios necesarios para que vivamos una vida racional y segura. La avaricia aleja nuestra mirada de las cosas celestiales y la fija firmemente en las cosas del mundo. Para combatir el pecado de la codicia, necesitamos **la virtud de la generosidad**. Una persona codiciosa es un acaparador, siempre quitando y guardando; una persona generosa es capaz de dar libremente a otros lo que haya recibido, especialmente a los pobres y necesitados. **La envidia es el resentimiento de la buena fortuna o las bendiciones de otros**. La envidia no es simplemente desear los dones y bendiciones de otros; La envidia desea que el otro pierda esos dones y bendiciones. La envidia se regocija cuando ve a nuestro prójimo abatido. Para combatir la envidia, necesitamos **la virtud de la gratitud**. La gratitud desvía nuestra mirada de lo que Dios ha dado a los demás a lo que Dios me ha dado. Y cuando aprendemos a regocijarnos con lo que hemos recibido, también podemos aprender a alegrarnos por los dones de los demás. **La ira es la expresión desproporcionada de la hostilidad y el deseo de venganza**. No toda la ira es pecaminosa. La ira puede ser justa cuando está en proporción a las exigencias de la justicia y la razón, pero si supera estos límites, se convierte en un pecado destructivo. Para combatir la ira, necesitamos paciencia. Con paciencia, podemos soportar la injusticia sin ser consumidos por el deseo de venganza y destrucción. **La lujuria es el deseo desordenado o placer del placer sexual**, especialmente cuando este placer se busca solo, separado de su propósito unitivo y procreativo. Para combatir la lujuria, necesitamos la virtud de la castidad. La castidad es la integración adecuada de nuestra sexualidad dentro de toda nuestra persona, cuerpo y espíritu. Una persona casta no ha reprimido el deseo sexual, pero por la gracia de Dios lo ha dominado, de modo que no está abrumada y dominada por el deseo sexual. **La gula es el pecado de comer demasiado y alcohol**. Si bien no es pecado disfrutar de una comida maravillosa, incluso en ocasiones suntuosas, habitualmente consumir excesivamente la comida y la bebida hasta el punto de enfermarnos es autodestructivo y desperdicia lo que podría compartirse con los pobres. Para combatir la gula, necesitamos **la virtud de la templanza**. La templanza nos ayuda a controlar nuestros deseos corporales para que comamos para vivir, no vivamos para comer. **Y la pereza (a veces llamada acedia) es la aversión al trabajo**, ya sea físico o espiritual. La pereza no quiere nada más que descansar para sí mismo, pero espera beneficiarse del trabajo de los demás. Para combatir la pereza, necesitamos **la virtud de la diligencia**. La diligencia, nacida de la fortaleza, es la capacidad de permanecer enfocados, día tras día, en el trabajo físico, mental y espiritual que es necesario para que vivamos en seguridad, paz y santidad.
