Dear friends in Christ,

This Saturday February 9th, our Bishop Robert was at St. Michael's in Murrells Inlet to ordain the 2019 Diaconate class for the Diocese of Charleston. Upon their ordination, these new deacons were received into the first degree of the Sacrament of Holy Orders, the sacrament through which the Apostolic ministry and mission entrusted by Christ to his Church is continued until the end of time. The first degree of Holy Orders is called the Diaconate (deacons); the second and third degrees are called the Presbyterate (priests) and the Episcopate (bishops).

The order of Deacons goes all the way back to the days of the Apostles, as we see in the sixth chapter of the Book of Acts: "At that time, as the number of disciples continued to grow, the Hellenists complained against the Hebrews because their widows were being neglected in the daily distribution. So the Twelve called together the community of the disciples and said, "It is not right for us to neglect the word of God to serve at table. Brothers, select from among you seven reputable men, filled with the Spirit and wisdom, whom we shall appoint to this task, whereas we shall devote ourselves to prayer and to the ministry of the word." The proposal was acceptable to the whole community, so they chose Stephen, a man filled with faith and the Holy Spirit, also Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicholas of Antioch, a convert to Judaism. They presented these men to the apostles who prayed and laid hands on them." And so was born the Order of Deacons in the earliest days of the Church.

However, by the early middle ages, the diaconate was perceived largely as merely an intermediate step toward the reception of priestly ordination, and was no longer seen as a permanent degree of Holy Orders. Then, the Fathers of the Second Vatican Council called for the restoration of the Permanent Diaconate, and in 1967 Pope Paul VI issued the decree *Sacrum Diaconatus Ordinem*, restoring this sacred order.

We are blessed here at St. Andrew's to be served by five permanent deacons, Deacons Buzz Barlow, George Ferland, Bob Jones, Tony Russo, and Bob Sprouse. According to their order, these men serve our community by their assistance at the Eucharist, reading the Holy Gospel and serving as an Ordinary Minister of Communion, by the celebration of baptisms, by blessing marriages in the name of the Church, and by officiating at funerals, and other acts of service, such as visiting the sick. The permanent deacons here at St. Andrew's and throughout the church provide an invaluable ministry of service for our parish and community, and we need more men in formation to step into the role when the current generation retires from ministry. If you are a Catholic man in good standing with the Church, active in parish ministry, between the ages of 30 and 55, and you feel called to serve the Church in the permanent diaconate, please contact us in the office.

Participants in the March for Life exercised the five Rights in the First Amendment of the Constitution:

- 1) Freedom of Religion - Speaking and acting in public, driven by faith and conscience
- 2) Freedom of Speech - Speaking opinions publicly, without fear
- 3) Freedom of the Press - Thoughts, opinions and prayers disseminated openly
- 4) Right to Peaceably Assemble - Marching, standing and associating together without violence
- 5) Right to Petition for Redress of Grievances - The entire March for Life is a public admonishment of the Supreme Court for assuming to itself the power to legalize abortion

For 46 years, the March for Life has been a growing witness, especially from young Americans, to the sacred gift of life. Our organizers experienced the joy, hope and dedication of students from across the nation as they spoke with us at our March for Life exhibit in Washington.

## GOSPEL MEDITATION

### ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

Do you have enough? Many of us come from a nation of material abundance. We have all the things we could possibly need not only to survive, but to thrive - food, shelter, mental ability, income, access to medical care. Most people in human history lived with far less than we. So why are we so dissatisfied? Some Christians can be drawn to the "prosperity Gospel." This is the idea that following God will bring us material abundance in this life.

That surely seems to be the story of today's Gospel! Peter and his friends chose - with some faith - to put out their nets a final time at Jesus' command. "They caught a great number of fish and their nets were tearing. They signaled to their partners in the other boat to come to help them. They came and filled both boats so that they were in danger of sinking." What gift! What abundance! What prosperity! Peter and his friends caught more fish than they'd ever seen. Yet what is their response to this material abundance, this gift from God? They leave it behind. "When they brought their boats to the shore, they left everything and followed him."

Praying for God to meet our physical, material needs is not a bad thing! Jesus himself includes "give us this day our daily bread" in the prayer he teaches his disciples. The question is, how do we respond when our prayers are answered? Do we thank God briefly, or perhaps ignore Him completely and move on with our lives? Or do we respond as Peter did? "God ? You showed up in an area that has no bearing on my eternal salvation. You gave me a gift I didn't even really need. You love me! You really do love me." Is our gratitude only surface level? Or do we allow ourselves, like Peter did, to respond with wonder, awe, and deeper discipleship?

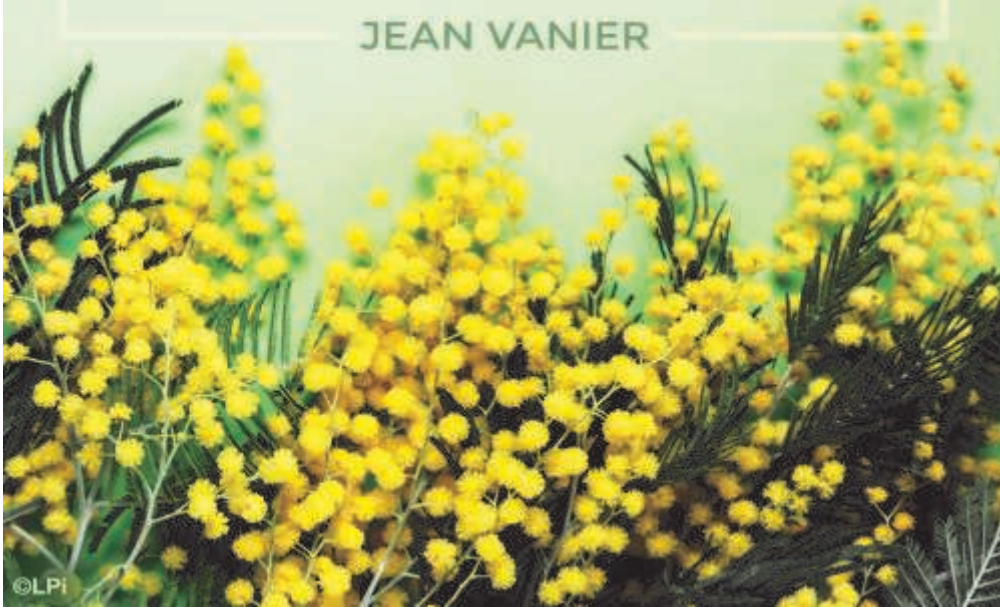

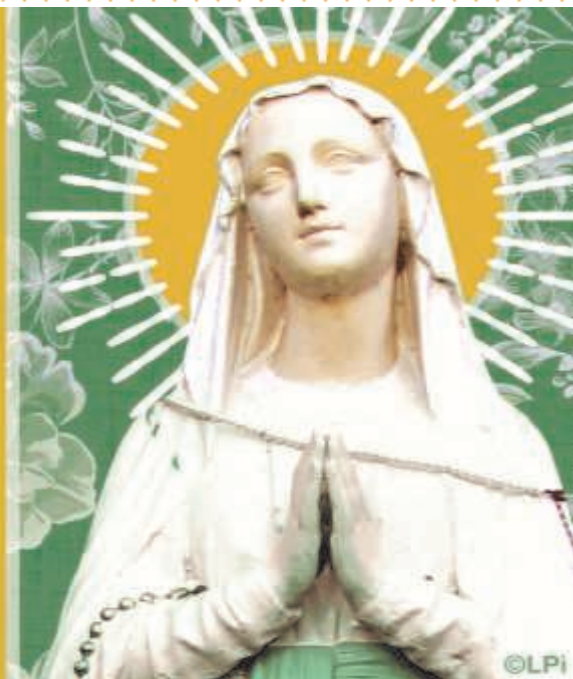

# IGLESIA CATÓLICA DE SAN ANDRÉS

10 de febrero de 2019

Queridos amigos en Cristo,

Este sábado 9 de febrero, nuestro obispo Robert estuvo en St. Michael's en Murrells Inlet para ordenar la clase de Diaconado 2019 para la Diócesis de Charleston. Tras su ordenación, estos nuevos diáconos fueron recibidos en el primer grado del Sacramento de las Ordenes Sagradas, el sacramento a través del cual el ministerio apostólico y la misión confiada por Cristo a su Iglesia se continúa hasta el fin de los tiempos. El primer grado de las órdenes sagradas se llama diaconado (diáconos); El segundo y tercer grado se llaman presbiterado (sacerdotes) y episcopado (obispos).

El orden de los diáconos se remonta a los días de los apóstoles, como vemos en el sexto capítulo del Libro de los Hechos: "En ese momento, a medida que el número de discípulos seguía creciendo, los helenistas se quejaban contra los hebreos porque sus viudas fueron descuidadas en la distribución diaria. Entonces los Doce reunieron a la comunidad de los discípulos y dijeron: "No es correcto que descuidemos la palabra de Dios para servir en la mesa. Hermanos, seleccione entre ustedes siete hombres de buena reputación, llenos del Espíritu y la sabiduría, a quienes asignaremos para esta tarea, mientras que nos dedicaremos a la oración y al ministerio de la palabra ". La propuesta fue aceptable para toda la comunidad. así que eligieron a Esteban, un hombre lleno de fe y del Espíritu Santo, también Felipe, Procoro, Nicanor, Timón, Parmenas y Nicolás de Antioquía, conversos al judaísmo. Presentaron a estos hombres a los apóstoles que oraron y les impusieron las manos ". Y así nació la Orden de los Diáconos en los primeros días de la Iglesia.

Sin embargo, a comienzos de la Edad Media, el diaconado se percibía en gran medida como un mero paso intermedio hacia la recepción de la ordenación sacerdotal, y ya no se consideraba un grado permanente de las Ordenes Sagradas. Luego, los Padres del Concilio Vaticano II pidieron la restauración del Diaconado Permanente, y en 1967 el Papa Pablo VI emitió el decreto *Sacrum Diaconatus Ordinem*, que restablece esta orden sagrada.

Somos bendecidos aquí en St. Andrew's para ser atendidos por cinco diáconos permanentes, los diáconos Buzz Barlow, George Ferland, Bob Jones, Tony Russo y Bob Sprouse. De acuerdo con su orden, estos hombres sirven a nuestra comunidad con su asistencia en la Eucaristía, leyendo el Santo Evangelio y sirviendo como un Ministro Ordinario de Comunión, celebrando bautismos, bendiciendo matrimonios en nombre de la Iglesia y oficiando en funerales, y otros actos de servicio, como visitar a los enfermos. Los diáconos permanentes aquí en St. Andrew's y en toda la iglesia brindan un invaluable ministerio de servicio para nuestra parroquia y comunidad, y necesitamos más hombres en formación para asumir el rol cuando la generación actual se retire del ministerio. Si usted es un hombre católico con buena reputación en la Iglesia, activo en el ministerio parroquial, entre las edades de 30 y 55 años, y se siente llamado a servir a la Iglesia en el diaconado permanente, contáctenos en la oficina.
