Dear Friends in Christ,

This July 29th will mark the 50th anniversary of the publication of the papal encyclical *Humanae Vitae*, written by Pope Paul VI in response to the development and widespread availability of the contraceptive pill, first approved by the FDA in 1960. In *Humanae Vitae*, Paul VI reaffirmed the ancient and constant teaching of the church on the nature of married love, responsible parenthood, and the rejection of unnatural forms of birth control, such as the contraceptive pill. And so, leading up to July 29th, we will devote our next three bulletin letters to a consideration of this document, so that we might all have a better understanding of the Church's teaching on conjugal life and fertility and, by understanding, learn also to embrace this teaching, and live wholeheartedly according to God's design.

The social situation in which *Humanae Vitae* was written and received was tumultuous (to say the very least). The widespread availability of the birth control pill was but one aspect of the Sexual Revolution of the 1960's, which brought about a variety of radical changes in our cultural attitudes toward sex, sexuality, homosexuality, monogamy, marriage, and family. This, along with the perennial concerns regarding the difficulties involved with bearing and raising many children, as well as widespread concerns of world overpopulation, resulted in John XXIII calling for a commission to study the question of contraception. The commission, known as the Pontifical Commission on Birth Control, was expanded by Paul VI to include over 70 theologians, physicians, laywomen, bishops, and cardinals. Ultimately, the Commission came to a divided conclusion, with the majority of members recommending that artificial contraception be allowed under certain circumstances, and a minority of members urging that the Church should not, indeed, could not change its perennial teaching.

Paul VI received these reports in 1966 and considered their findings. When *Humanae Vitae* was published in 1968, Paul VI upheld the long-standing teaching of the Church, which rejects any artificial contraceptive as destructive to the nature of the marriage and the marital act, as well as contrary to the dignity of the human person. On the other hand, he explicitly condoned the various forms of natural family planning. We should note well that this was no innovation; it was simply continuous with what the Church had always held and taught. Nevertheless, those who wanted a different answer did not have ears to hear. Sad to say, many Catholics, both lay and clergy, openly rejected the teaching, often referring to the majority finding of the Commission. But we must remember that the Holy Spirit does not guide or guarantee the findings of any commission, council, focus group, or board of experts. The Spirit guides the Church into all truth through the magisterial teachings of the Bishops and especially of the Vicar of Christ.

That Pope Paul was guided by the Spirit in writing *Humanae Vitae* cannot today be doubted, considering the prophetic power present in the document. In this document, Paul warns of four particular negative results which the acceptance of contraception would bring about. With fifty years of hindsight, we are able to see just how powerful and prophetic is *Humanae Vitae*. Next week, we will continue with a consideration of these predictions, and how they have each come to pass.

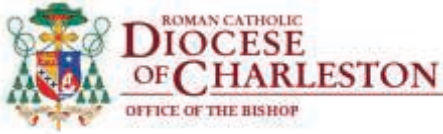

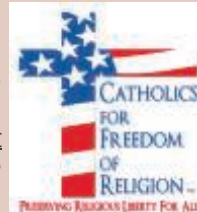

SUPREME COURT NARROWLY UPHOLDS FREEDOM OF RELIGION

In a 7-2 decision, the U.S. Supreme Court overturned Colorado courts and found that baker Jack Phillips was not guilty of discrimination when he declined to design a wedding cake for a same-sex couple because of his religious beliefs. However, the decision is narrow since the court merely found that Colorado only exhibited anti-religious bias due to: (1) hostility aimed at Phillips' religious beliefs, (2) the different treatment Colorado gave a parallel case allowing bakeries to refuse to make cakes criticizing same-sex marriage. Therefore, a definitive decision, resolving the underlying dispute between "non-discrimination" principles and freedom of speech and religion, will have to await another case and another decision.

RELIGIOUS PERSECUTION - INTERNATIONAL REPORT:

NIGERIA: In 2014, Boko Haram (meaning 'Western Education is Forbidden') abducted 270 mostly Christian girls from a boarding school in Chibok. The leader said, "I abducted your girls; there is a market for selling humans." Only the Christian girls are allowed to be sold into slavery and prostitution.

By 2018, about 60 of these girls had escaped, others were released after payments made, and about 100 are still in captivity. But, once again, Boko Haram has kidnapped over 100 mostly Christian schoolgirls in their campaign to spread panic and terror. To date, Boko Haram has killed more than 20,000 people and forced 2 million others to flee their homes in predominantly Christian southern Nigeria.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

"He summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two by two." This Sunday we read the first sending of the Apostles to preach, teach, and heal. For many of us, it can be easy to think we "just don't have enough" to be disciples and evangelists ourselves. We don't have enough education and training. We don't have enough experience talking to people about Jesus. We don't pray enough. We don't have enough faith.

If you look at the Apostles in today's Gospel reading, they didn't have much either. "No food, no sack, no money in their belts." They didn't plan out their itinerary or book their lodging in advance. From what we know of the Apostles, they were not the religiously trained and educated ones. They were fisherman, tax collectors, and political activists. But what does being a fisherman require? Someone like Peter needed a strong work ethic to rise at strange hours. He needed patient calm to wait for the catch. Once ashore, he needed a savvy mind to fetch a good price for his labors.

As Peter became a fisher of men, he would need diligence to persevere through the hard journeys, long days, and persecution that awaited him. He would need patient calm with those who disagreed with him. As the leader of the Apostles, he would need a savvy mind to navigate challenges facing the early Church. From one perspective, Peter has nothing to offer the mission of Jesus. Thinking more creatively, one can see that -- joined with faith and love -- perhaps Peter had everything he needed.

Jesus sends you as well. As you take stock of your own talents, consider how they might be offered as a gift to others. Maybe you already have more than enough.

(Mc. 6:8-9). ¡Qué barbaridad, diríamos ahora, por tan pocas cosas! La sociedad de hoy obliga, sobre todo a los jóvenes, a obtener cosas innecesarias para cualquier viaje. Cargan tanto, que hasta se lastiman el cuerpo, llegan al mal humor y, al final, descubren que no necesitaban tanto. Para ser feliz se necesita poco y se requiere abrir el corazón a las necesidades de los demás.

Si cargamos poco podemos admirar lo que existe alrededor, ayudar a los necesitados, descansar y realizar la misión que Jesús nos ha encomendado. Las personas lo experimentan cuando reciben una llamada por teléfono, si es urgente responden de inmediato. Escuchan y actúan. De igual manera, los discípulos que Jesús envió actuaron como si hubieran recibido una llamada urgente. ¿Cómo respondes al llamado urgente de Jesús de ayudar al necesitado? ¿Te haces el que no escucha y sigues sin actuar? El Evangelio es de gran ayuda para dos cosas. Primero, para escuchar que Jesús nos envía a cumplir una misión. Segundo, para que nos demos cuenta de que es urgente. Tan urgente es, que no necesitamos mucho para ir. Basta con tener un buen espíritu, y donde no reciban al enviado, hay que sacudirse el polvo de los zapatos y seguir adelante. ¡Así de sencillo es el Evangelio!
