Dear friends in Christ,

The first document given to the Church by the Fathers of the Second Vatican Council was *Sacrosanctum Concilium*, the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy. This document called for a renewal and revitalization of the liturgy, in order to help the people of God fully, actively, and consciously participate in the mysteries we celebrate. This call for a renewal of the liturgy resulted in the New Order of Mass, which was promulgated under Paul VI in 1969, which was intended to help foster the desired renewal. However, changes to the order of Mass can only be a beginning to a liturgical renewal. True renewal comes from how we receive and live out the changes. What puts flesh on the bones of texts and rubrics are the *ars celebrandi et adorandi*, the art of celebrating the liturgy properly and adoring the Lord devoutly.

This theme was expanded upon by the Council Fathers in their Dogmatic Constitution on the Church, *Lumen Gentium*, where they taught: "The liturgy must favor and make shine brightly the sense of the sacred. It must be imbued with reverence, adoration and glorification of God."

So, how do we celebrate the liturgy, especially the Holy Mass, in a way that is imbued with reverence and adoration? How do we make our sense of the sacred shine brightly?

First, we must all recognize that when we are here at Mass, we are *all* engaged in acting out the sacred, cosmic drama of our redemption. We are all engaged in making art: the *ars celebrandi*, the art of celebrating. The celebration of the Eucharist is not a spectacle at which the people are merely present; we must all be engaged in the art of celebrating. And, like any other art, the art of celebrating requires attention and focus. We must all be fully aware of our actions and speech in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, lest we make a poor showing. Distractions must be kept to a minimum; phones should be turned off, conversation should cease and silence should take hold in every heart. We must practice the discipline of self-recollection and movement toward the Lord, and to do this we must pray. The moments before Mass begins should be spent in silent prayer, not idleness or chatter. During the Mass, we should know and make our ritual gestures and responses, singing when we are called to sing, speaking when we are called to speak, with clarity and conviction. And by no means should we ever leave Mass before the final blessing and dismissal; rather, we should linger after the Mass has ended, to offer prayers of thanksgiving and then to spend time in fellowship with our brothers and sisters.

Dear friends, we who gather in the name of the Lord to fulfil his command, "Do this in memory of me," are not merely a crowd; we are a congregation. But in order to be a congregation, we must all be gathered with a single purpose: to give proper adoration and glory to God through the practice of the art of celebrating. May the Lord who gives his Body and Blood to us as food and drink help us all to become masters of this art on earth, so that we might sing his praises forever in the glory of heaven!





Changing Lives. Building Hope.

The opioid crisis has been declared a public health emergency both nationally and in the state of South Carolina. The following is but

a sampling of facts:

- ◆ Horry County is #1 for opioid mortality rates in all of South Carolina.
- ◆ In 2017, there were over 330,000 prescriptions written in Horry County, for approximately 25 million opioids.
- ◆ In 2017, there were 93 overdose deaths in Horry County.
- ◆ A survey completed at the Horry County Drug Court found that 80% of all graduates stated that they got their first prescription drugs from the medicine cabinet of their parents, grandparents or friends.
- ◆ 60% of all poison controls calls are for accidental overdoses of children under 5.
- ◆ 5 million pain killer prescriptions are filled every year in South Carolina – that's more than one for every person in our state.
- ◆ 1 in 4 people who are prescribed opioids struggle with addiction.
- ◆ 1 IN 4 teens has misused or abused or abused a prescription drug at least once.
- ◆ IN 2016, 550 deaths in South Carolina were prescription opioid overdoses. That's an increase of 18% from 2014.

Shoreline Behavioral Health Services in Conway has launched a program designed to significantly reduce the prescription drugs in homes that are either no longer needed or outdated. More and more adults recognize the need to remove these substances from the home. A representative from Shoreline will be present next weekend after the Sat-4:30pm Mass, Sun after the 9:15, 11am and the Spanish Mass at 7pm to hand out flyers that list locations to drop-off unwanted/unused medications for safe disposal.



GOSPEL MEDITATION ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE


If you have been closely following the Sunday readings, today's Gospel could sound a bit like a broken record. Four weeks ago, the Gospel told of Jesus visiting his home of Nazareth and being poorly received by his family members. Jesus had attracted a large crowd as he preached, and his concerned relatives came to bring him home. Jesus, they thought, was out of his league. Today Jesus takes things further. He returns to Nazareth. Rather than preaching from his house, he enters the synagogue. He speaks eloquently. The listeners acknowledge that "wisdom has been given him" and recognize the "mighty deeds wrought by his hands," but it is too much for them to bear. "Is he not the carpenter, the son of Mary?" The listeners know his whole clan, his male and female relatives. Jesus as carpenter was acceptable. Even Jesus as fringe preacher was interesting enough to draw a crowd. But Jesus as authoritative teacher is too much. "They took offense at him."

As Christians, we have known the truth of Jesus' identity since we were first introduced to him. He is fully human and fully divine. He is the second person of the Trinity. It could be easy to look down on these 1st century listeners for their lack of faith. But where do we expect to learn our own lessons? The more we age, the easier it is to believe we understand the world and how it works. We have experience with people, with the Church, with politics, and with the affairs of daily living. We have developed criteria for first impressions. We categorize. Today we remember that the Christian life requires humility. Jesus' listeners have an expectation of how things should be, and their lack of faith causes doubt in others. "He was not able to perform any mighty deeds there." Do your assumptions limit your perspective? Who can you learn from that you did not expect?



MEDITACIÓN EVANGÉLICO - ALENTAR ENTENDIMIENTO MÁS PROFUNDO DE LA ESCRITURA (Gospel Meditation)

Con frecuencia nos sorprendemos y hasta nos quedamos boquiabiertos cuando una persona sencilla, sin estudios, sobresale en su familia y su ambiente. No podemos creer sus logros. No aceptamos su liderazgo. Tiene que salir a otros lugares para que la reconozcan. ¿Has experimentado esto en tu vida? ¿Conoces a alguien que haya vivido esa experiencia? Pues, algo parecido le pasó a Jesús en su pueblo, donde las personas se preguntaban: "¿No es éste el carpintero?". Y Jesús afirma: "Si hay un lugar donde un profeta es despreciado, es en su tierra, entre sus parientes y en su propia familia". Las acciones de Jesús iban más allá de lo que un carpintero podía hacer o saber. Lo triste de esta situación entre las personas del pueblo de Jesús, es que estaban completamente ciegos, bloqueados y, por lo tanto, no pudieron gozar de la cercanía y los beneficios que el "carpintero" les ofrecía. Al sentirse tan ofendidos, limitaron la gracia de Dios y, a la vez, a Jesús en su demostración de la presencia del Reino de Dios entre su pueblo. ¡Qué pena!, diríamos nosotros. Pero la enseñanza del Evangelio es abierta, grande, ancha en la persistencia de Dios de acercarse a los que lo reciben. Ahora, cabe preguntarse: ¿Quién me ha guiado a la sabiduría de Dios en la trayectoria de mi vida? ¿He limitado alguna vez la acción del Señor Jesús por prejuicios? ¿Qué dirá la gente de lo que hago por otros? Recordemos que por el bautismo somos profetas de esperanza en este mundo roto por el pecado. Lo bueno es que la sabiduría de Dios es fiel compañera de quien la acepta para hacer el bien en su tierra y fuera de ella.
