Dear Friends in Christ,

This Thursday we here in the United States will observe Thanksgiving, as we do each year on the fourth Thursday of November. Of course, festivals and rituals of thanksgiving are ancient, and have existed for thousands of years across many cultures and civilizations, but we in America traditionally trace our Thanksgiving back to the year 1621, when, after their first successful growing season, the Pilgrim settlers at Plymouth Plantation celebrated a three-day feast along with members of the Wampanoag Indian tribe. Of this day, Edward Winslow, one of the leaders of Plymouth Colony, wrote, "Our harvest being gotten in, our governor sent four men on fowling, that so we might after a special manner rejoice together after we had gathered the fruits of our labor. They four in one day killed as much fowl as, with a little help beside, served the company almost a week. At which time, amongst other recreations, we exercised our arms, many of the Indians coming amongst us, and among the rest their greatest king Massasoit, with some ninety men, whom for three days we entertained and feasted." This feast is typically remembered as the first Thanksgiving.

After the American Revolution, the presidents of the United States often proclaimed a day of Thanksgiving, but it did not necessarily occur every year, nor was the date fixed. In 1863, in the midst of the Civil War, Abraham Lincoln proclaimed a day of Thanksgiving to be celebrated on the final Thursday of November. Thanksgiving continued on the final Thursday of November until December 1941, when Congress established the fourth Thursday of November as the federal holiday of Thanksgiving, and so it has been celebrated since 1942.

In the proclamation of 1863, we read the following: "The year that is drawing towards its close, has been filled with the blessings of fruitful fields and healthful skies. To these bounties, which are so constantly enjoyed that we are prone to forget the source from which they come, others have been added, which are of so extraordinary a nature that they cannot fail to penetrate and soften even the heart, which is habitually insensible to the ever-watchful providence of Almighty God.... I do therefore invite my fellow citizens in every part of the United States, and also those who are at sea and those who are sojourning in foreign lands, to set apart and observe the last Thursday of November next, as a day of Thanksgiving and Praise to our beneficent Father who dwelleth in the Heavens."

Dear friends, it is impossible to be truly grateful without recognizing that what we have, we have received. The creation is a gift. The world and all its bounty and wonderful intricacy and awesome beauty; our faith, our Church, and our families; our health and prosperity, and even our very lives all have been given to us by our beneficent Father who lives and reigns forever in Heaven. And so, this Thanksgiving, let us all remember that this is not a day devoted to gluttony and sloth, but to joy, peace, love, and gratitude. Let us give thanks to almighty God, and ask him to help us always to live with deep gratitude for the gifts of life, love, and freedom.

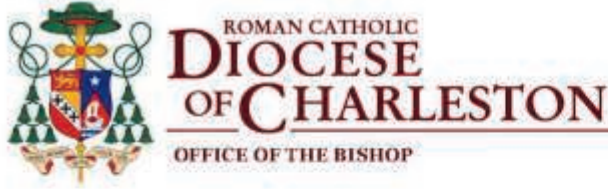

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As a diocese, we will soon take up the national collection for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD). Your support to this collection brings change to communities across the country and empowers those living in poverty to transform the places they live into reflections of the Kingdom of God. Your support goes a long way in creating communities that are more just and welcoming to those who live trapped in the cycle of poverty. In addition, your support provides training for people to gain tools for community organizing and opportunities for leaders to bring these issues to the public arena. With your help, residents have advocated for tenant protections and increased housing availability in their community.

**CATHOLICS FOR FREEDOM OF RELIGION****Pilgrims, Thanksgiving, & a Failed Experiment: Part 1**

**A Quick History:** The *Mayflower* set sail from England on Sept. 6, 1620, and arrived at Cape Cod on Nov. 11, 1620. The ship moved on to Plymouth with its 102 Pilgrims and on Nov. 21, 1620, they drafted and signed the *Mayflower Compact*, a legal document, "in the presence of God, and of one another, (to) covenant and combine ourselves together into a civil body politic."

Weakened from the 65 day voyage and unprepared for the harsh winter, by spring, half had died from starvation and disease. Fortunately, with the help of local Native Americans (Indians), the 53 remaining Pilgrims learned to plant and harvested an abundant crop by fall. Thus, the First Thanksgiving was to celebrate a successful harvest and give thanks to God.

**The Experiment: The Pilgrims decided that their new community would create a collectivist model of governance where all labor was communal**, with men raising crops for all families, not just their own, and women engaged in domestic chores for their neighbors. **Few did more than the minimal because the incentive to excel was destroyed. Within two years, the result was shortages and starvation. The Pilgrims' Governor, William Bradford, described the folly of collectivism**, "For this community was found to breed much confusion and discontent and retard much employment that would have been to their benefit and comfort. For the young men, that were most able and fit for labour and service, did repine (complain) that they should spend their time and strength to work for other men's wives and children without any recompense (payment)... And for men's wives to be commanded to do service for other men, as dressing their meat, washing their clothes, etc., they deemed it a kind of slavery, neither could many husbands brook (tolerate) it."

**Gov. Bradford also spoke about another problem from this created famine - thievery. "much was stolen both by night and day..."**

# IGLESIA CATÓLICA DE SAN ANDRÉS

18 de noviembre de 2018

Queridos amigos en Cristo,

Este jueves aquí en Estados Unidos celebraremos el Día de Acción de Gracias, como lo hacemos todos los años el cuarto jueves de noviembre. Por supuesto, los festivales y rituales de acción de gracias son antiguos, y han existido durante miles de años en muchas culturas y civilizaciones, pero en Estados Unidos tradicionalmente seguimos nuestra Acción de Gracias desde el año 1621, cuando, después de su primera temporada de crecimiento exitosa, los colonos peregrinos en Plymouth Plantation celebró una fiesta de tres días junto con miembros de la tribu india Wampanoag. A partir de este día, Edward Winslow, uno de los líderes de la colonia de Plymouth, escribió: "Al llegar nuestra cosecha, nuestro gobernador envió a cuatro hombres a cazar, para que, después de una manera especial, nos regocijemos después de haber recogido los frutos de nuestra labor. Los cuatro en un día cazaron muchas aves, con un poco de ayuda servimos a nuestros invitados casi una semana. En ese momento, entre otras recreaciones, practicamos nuestras armas, muchos de los indios vinieron o hacia nosotros y entre ellos, su gran rey Massasoit, con unos noventa hombres, a los que durante tres días entretuvimos y festejamos ". Esta fiesta es típicamente recordada como la primera acción de gracias en nuestro país.

Después de la Revolución Americana, los presidentes de los Estados Unidos a menudo proclamaron un día de Acción de Gracias, pero no necesariamente ocurrió todos los años, ni se fijó la fecha. En 1863, en medio de la Guerra Civil, Abraham Lincoln proclamó que un día de Acción de Gracias se celebraría el último jueves de noviembre. El Día de Acción de Gracias continuó el último jueves de noviembre hasta diciembre de 1941, cuando el Congreso estableció el cuarto jueves de noviembre como feriado federal del Día de Acción de Gracias, y así se celebra desde 1942.

En la proclamación de 1863, leemos lo siguiente: "El año que se acerca a su fin, ha estado lleno de bendiciones de campos fructíferos y cielos saludables. A estas bondades, que se disfrutaban tan constantemente que somos propensos a olvidar la fuente de donde provienen, se han agregado otras, que son de una naturaleza tan extraordinaria que no pueden dejar de penetrar y ablandar incluso el corazón, que es habitualmente insensible. a la siempre vigilante providencia del Dios Todopoderoso ... Por lo tanto, invito a mis conciudadanos en todas partes de los Estados Unidos, y también a aquellos que están en el mar y a los que están viajando en tierras extranjeras, a apartar y observar el último jueves de noviembre próximo, como un día de Acción de Gracias y Alabanza. a nuestro Padre benevolente que mora en los cielos ".

Queridos amigos, es imposible estar verdaderamente agradecidos sin reconocer que lo que tenemos, lo hemos recibido. La creación es un regalo. El mundo y toda su generosidad y maravillosa complejidad y asombrosa belleza; nuestra fe, nuestra iglesia y nuestras familias; nuestra salud y prosperidad, e incluso nuestras propias vidas, nos las ha dado nuestro Padre benevolente que vive y reina por siempre en el Cielo. Y así, este Día de Acción de Gracias, recordemos que este no es un día dedicado a la gula y la pereza, sino a la alegría, la paz, el amor y la gratitud. Demos gracias al Dios todopoderoso y pidámosle que nos ayude a vivir siempre con profunda gratitud por los dones de la vida, el amor y la libertad.

Este acto fue el culmen de un largo proceso devocional hacia la Madre de la Divina Providencia empezado por el obispo Catalán Gil Esteve y Tomás quien trajo la primera imagen de la Virgen a la isla Boricua.

La imagen actual es de María sentada con su Hijo (la Divina Providencia) dormido sobre su regazo. Ella sostiene la manita izquierda del niño en sus manos mientras lo mira cariñosamente. La imagen inspira ternura y muestra la confianza de María en la Divina Providencia de su Hijo, que aunque este dormido, no se descuida de ella ni de los fieles.

Esta imagen recuerda el pasaje bíblico en el cual Jesús dormía en la barca de Pedro, despertando a tiempo para calmar los mares y los vientos que la amenazaban. He aquí que la devoción a la Madre de la Divina Providencia es confiar que Dios siempre llega a nuestro amparo cuando lo invocamos.
