Dear Friends in Christ,

The Church is charged by Christ the Lord himself to go forth and share the Gospel, teaching the whole world to know and observe all that he has taught us. This is what we call the Great Commission, found in Matthew 20:16-20. Perhaps we most often think of this commission being fulfilled by missionaries who venture out into the far corners of the world, but in fact, the first place this commission is fulfilled is in our own home, especially within our own families and with our children. It is the serious duty of all Catholics to educate the next generation in the faith, a duty that begins in the home and extends into formal education. In order to help us fulfill this duty, many parishes operate Catholic schools, and for the past sixty-three years, St. Andrew's parish has worked to fulfill the Great Commission through St. Andrew's Catholic School. Our school is an extension and ministry of our whole parish family, and we should always remember our school with a sense of responsibility and care, including financial care.

While the largest source of income for our school is the tuition paid by the student families, this income is supplemented in a variety of ways by the whole parish, so that we can truly say the operation of our school is a work not only of the families with children enrolled here, but of our entire parish. Each year, the largest annual fundraiser for St. Andrew's School is Taste of the Town, which took place last Tuesday. Taste of the Town, now in its thirty-sixth year, has become an event beloved by the whole community, and we are happy to host our friends and neighbors here in Myrtle Beach for a wonderful evening of food and fun. And so, with the understanding that our school and this event belongs to us all, I wish this week to give a brief report on the use of the monies raised by Taste of the Town.

The funds raised by Taste of the Town are deposited in an account administered by the Diocese of Charleston and withdrawn over the course of the year for various purposes and projects determined by the school's Principal in consultation with the Pastor and St. Andrew's School Board. Last year, \$150,000 was raised, of which \$31,000 was used to provide scholarships for students in need; \$15,000 was spent to replace or repair classroom air conditioning units; \$10,000 was spent on landscaping; nearly \$13,000 was spent to install a gated fence at the entrance between the church and school and to install a security camera and remote access at the main daytime entrance, so that all visitors can be visually identified before being allowed access to the school grounds. \$49,000 was spent to help pay the salaries of our Technology and Curriculum Advisor and our Development Director. Our Technology and Curriculum Advisor works to develop the school's use of technology and to develop a technology curriculum, so that the students themselves are learning these technologies. To this end, we have provided for several years iPads™ for all our students, another project funded by Taste of the Town. Our Development Director organizes Taste of the Town each year as well as other efforts to promote our school, such as the recently organized St. Andrew's Alumni Association, our 5k run, the activities of Catholic School Week, Publix Partners, and other events. Any remaining funds from Taste of the Town is held in a Diocesan Savings and Loan account which is administered by the Diocese of Charleston, and is withdrawn as needed for emergent needs, and to help prepare for long-term development.

To all of our parishioners who support the work of our school in so many ways, thank you. Your continued support helps St. Andrew's to prepare the children of our parish and community for success and leadership in the world and to fulfill the Great Commission to share with them the Good News of Christ's love, teaching them to observe all he has commanded. May the Good Lord continue to bless you, and may he continue to guide and bless the work of St. Andrew's School.

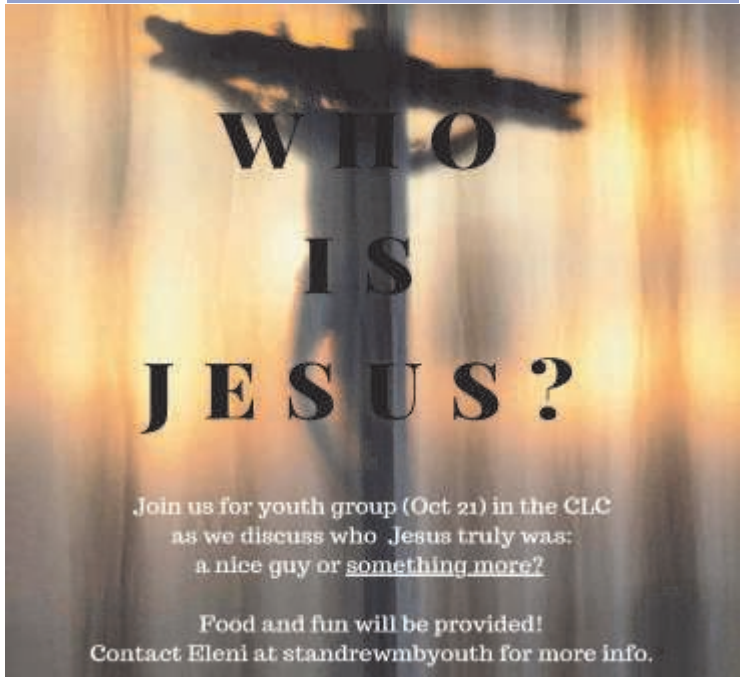

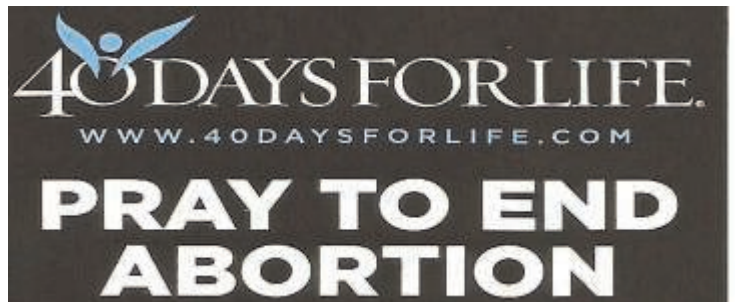

On the eve of World Youth Day 2016 in Poland, Pope Francis gave a beautiful address. . . urging leaders to support the family, the "primary and fundamental cell of society." Specifically, he urged them to welcome and protect human life in all its stages: "Life must always be welcomed and protected. These two things go together—welcome and protection, from conception to natural death."

The Holy Father said that responsibility for vulnerable families is shared in a particular way by the institutions of the State, the Church, and society. All of us are called to respect life and care for it. On the other hand, it is the responsibility of the State, the Church and society to accompany and concretely help all those who find themselves in serious difficulty, so that a child will never be seen as a burden but as a gift, and those who are most vulnerable and poor will not be abandoned.

In "Living the Gospel of Life," the U.S. bishops issued a similar "welcome and protect" challenge to ordinary citizens and high-powered leaders alike. Written in 1998, its insights remain fresh and relevant today.

All too often in debates, people pit the defense of innocent, defenseless lives in opposition to work promoting the dignity of other vulnerable persons throughout the lifespan. From a Catholic perspective, these issues need not be in competition, but they must be held in proper relation to each other for promotion of the common good. Our bishops proposed the beautiful image of the human person as the "living house of God," and taught that the right to life is the foundation on which that house stands, with all other human dignity

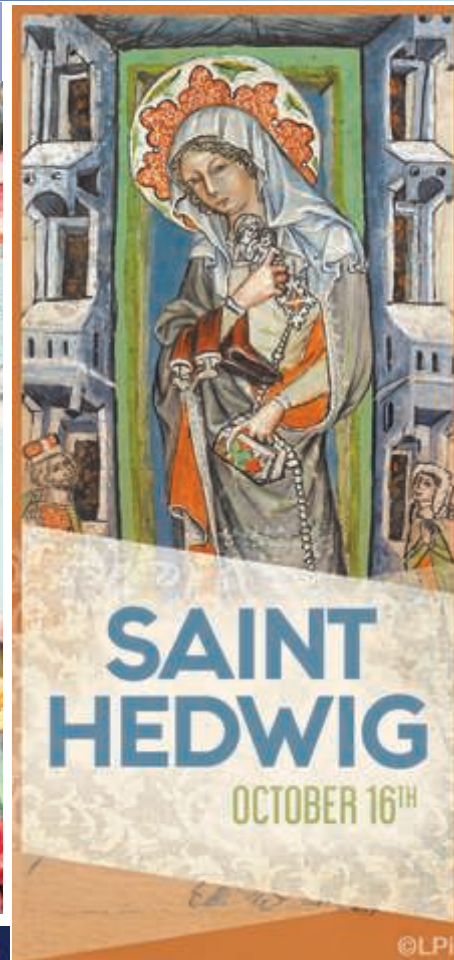
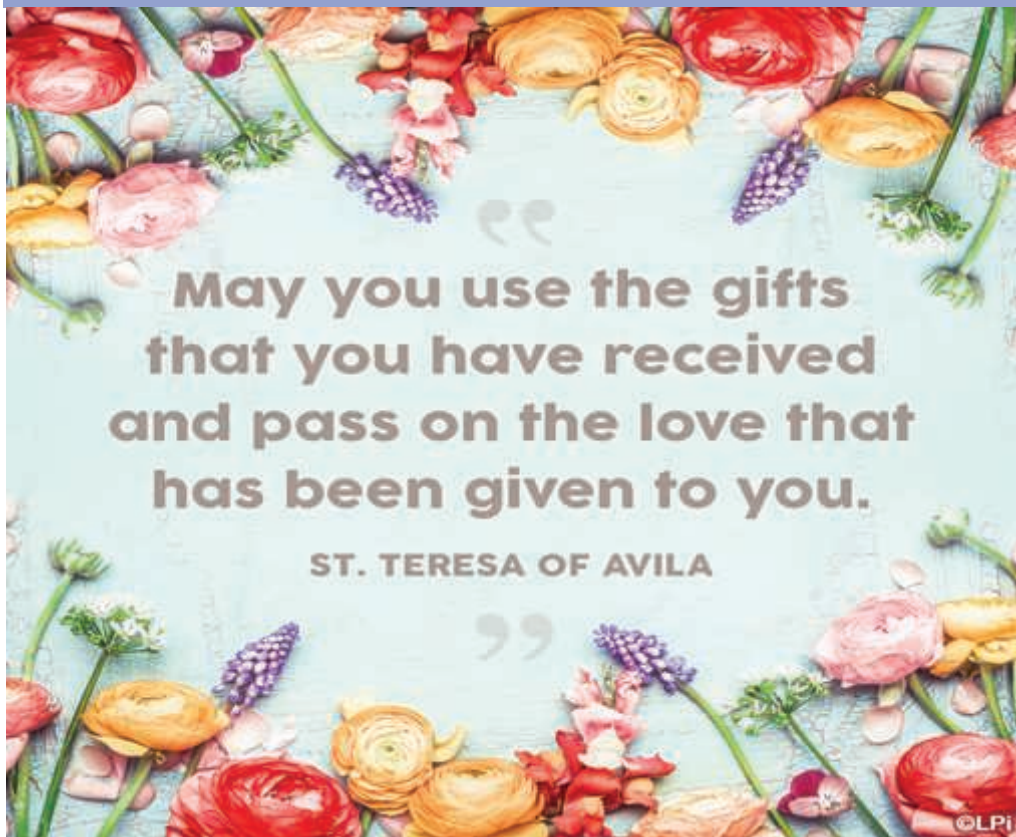
issues serving as the house's much-needed protective walls and crossbeams.

"Opposition to abortion and euthanasia does not excuse indifference to those who suffer from poverty, violence and injustice.... Catholics should eagerly involve themselves as advocates for the weak and marginalized in all these areas," they taught. The bishops then explain:

If we understand the human person as the 'temple of the Holy Spirit'—the living house of God—then these latter issues fall logically into place as the crossbeams and walls of that house. All direct attacks on innocent human life, such as abortion and euthanasia, strike at the house's foundation. These directly and immediately violate the human person's most fundamental right—the right to life. Neglect of these issues is the equivalent of building our house on sand. Such attacks cannot help but lull the social conscience in ways ultimately destructive of other human rights (Living the Gospel of Life, 22).

So the bishops' challenge gives us a constructive model for thinking about vital social and political concerns. Before voting this coming November, consider reading the entire statement along with the more recent "Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship (2015)" to enrich your conversations with friends, family members, and colleagues on these critical issues.

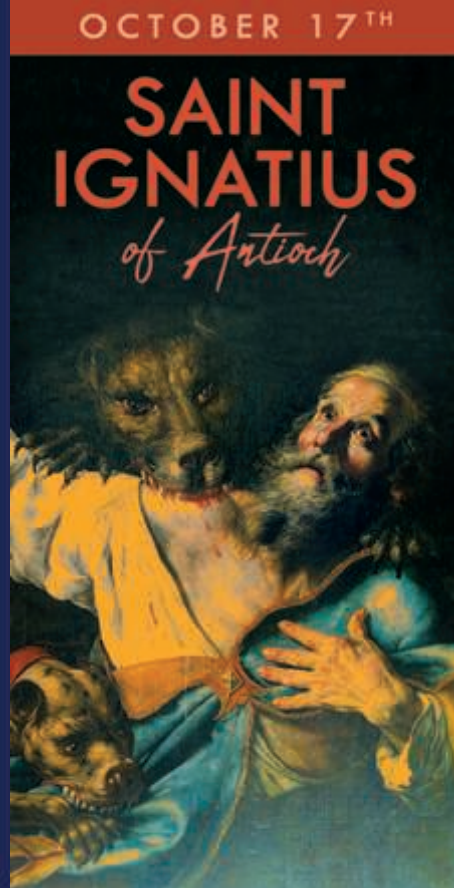

PALABRAS DE SABIDURÍA

Hoy aprendemos en la primera lectura que el espíritu de la sabiduría llega a los que lo invocan. La sabiduría, como la Palabra de Dios, lleva un mensaje de consuelo y a la vez constituye un gran desafío. La carta a los hebreos nos cuenta que la Palabra de Dios, que está empapada con la sabiduría de Dios, es “más penetrante que una espada de dos filos”. No podemos acobardarnos ante la sabiduría de Dios ni ante la palabra que tiene el poder de penetrar nuestro corazón y mente. Jesús, la Palabra viva de Dios, la encarnación de la sabiduría, le dice cosas fuertes y muy penetrantes al joven rico que acude a Jesús en busca de respuestas a sus dudas más profundas. Precisamente, cuando el joven pensaba que había hecho lo suficiente para cumplir los mandamientos de Dios, se le exigió más. Lo mismo sucede en nuestro caso.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Existe en Perú un mural milagroso de la Pasión de Jesucristo. Esta imagen reconocida como el Señor de los Milagros, el Cristo Moreno o el Cristo de Pachacamilla fue pintada por un angoleño en el siglo XVII para una cofradía de africanos. A mitad del siglo un fuerte terremoto sacudió a Lima y las paredes de la cofradía se cayeron, sin que se dañara el mural. Eventualmente la imagen se reveló como milagrosa para los que oraban delante de ella.

En la imagen aparece Jesús crucificado. Sobre él está el Espíritu Santo y el Padre. A la derecha de la cruz está su Madre con el corazón traspasado por una lanza y a su derecha, el fiel discípulo amado. Esta imagen es venerada como el Señor de los Milagros. Sin saberlo el artista angoleño ha pintado una reflexión teológica sobre la divinidad y la humanidad de Jesucristo. En su pasión redentora Jesús abre las puertas del cielo y de la comunicación entre el cielo y la tierra, entre Dios y la humanidad representada por la Madre y el discípulo.
